The Center for Disease for Disease Control and Prevention had the statistics about how 66% of teens dated in the last year and 1 in 12 report being in a violent relationship. The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention shares how teen dating violence has changed over the years and more ways to prevent being in a violent relationship.
